



Pleased to meet you! Or...great to connect with you again. Some of you might know me from my Flood Stories project, or the sustainable fashion event I organized on Earth Day (in April 2023), or by the articles I write about food and farming for Edible Vancouver and Wine Country magazine. But did you know that my first love and main area of specialization is children's literature? It's true! While I do love doing community projects with you all, my actual job is teaching KidLit at UFV. But what does that have to do with you? Let me explain...

I developed and run a series of rights-based children's programs that bring together books, human rights, and inquiry-based creative projects to support kids' resilience and reduce climate anxiety. Maybe someone you know-or even one of your own kids!-participated in pilots of my Dig for Your Rights! agricultural literacy program at Yarrow Community School. If so, you know that picture books are the foundation of all my programs. But you probably don't-yet!-know one of my fav author-illustrators, Allan Drummond, who created the Green Power picture book series. These showstoppers celebrate specific communities working together to make the world a better place. One of the reasons I love these books is that they remind me of our very own dearest Yarrow. The first time I visited Yarrow I was astounded by how beautiful it is. And I'm not alone: we're a little bit

Article submitted by Michelle Superle internet famous for being one of the most beautiful little towns around. People can hardly believe we even decorate Pioneer Park! (Thank you, Rhian, Desiree and ?!)

Then, because of the November 2021 flood, we became a lot famous as a community that works together to help each other-while helping to make the world a better place.

So I've been wondering: if Allan Drummond were to write a book about Yarrow, what would it be? The titles of Drummond's books all sound like this: Pedal Power: How One Community Became the Bicycle Capital of the World and Green City: The True Story of How One Community Survived a Tornado and Rebuilt for a Sustainable Future. While we'd be strong candidates for these titles, they're already taken.

We know we're beautiful, and we know we take care of one another. So...what's our superpower, Yarrow?

That's what I'm here to find out-and you can join me! Starting in January 2024, my programs will be shifting into the nonprofit organization 20 Harvest Challenge. And you can be part of it all! I'll be offering weekly workshops in January for creating items of beauty that also make the world more beautiful. All workshops use upcycled materials and focus on re-purposing pre-existing items into even more beautiful ones-including clothing, home decor, and functional necessities like gift wrap and shopping bags.

Some workshops will be held at the Yarrow

Ecovillage. Others will run through Fox & Thistle Mercantile. Yarrow's beautiful new one-stop-shop for sustainable home and personal care goods, as well as vintage fashion.

Stay tuned for details on these "Joyful January" workshops jointly offered through my 20 Harvest Challenge program and Fox & Thistle Mercantile. They'll include "Summer All Year" dried flower wall hangings, no-sew bunting, super chonk velvet mushroom mobiles, and low-sew "Summer's Coming" bathing suit coverups.

As well, you can look forward to-and help cocreate!---the 20 Harvest Challenge Joy Museum, Yarrow edition, plus more sustainable fashion fun for Earth Day.





So Who Is This Santa Guy Anyway?

After much research, (Google) it turns out he was a real person whose life inspired a wealth of legends that have evolved over the centuries. St. Nicholas was a bishop in the early Christian church who became the patron saint of sailors, merchants, archers, repentant thieves, children, brewers, pawnbrokers, unmarried people, and students. Quite the varied portfolio.

Pretty much all the sources agree that he was a wealthy person of Greek descent who lived (AD \sim 270-343) in what is present-day Turkey. After his parents' death he donated all the family wealth to the poor. The legend that seems to cement his status as patron saint of children tells how he revived three children who had been pickled for ham by a disreputable butcher. Shudder! There are quite a few depictions of him with the kids but I just couldn't bear to put any in here. Picture #1 above was painted in 1243.

Since the middle ages Saint Nicholas has had a large following in Holland where he is nicknamed Sinter Klaus, a contraction for Sint Nikolaas. His feast day is December 6th celebrated as an occasion to help the poor, by putting money in their shoes (which evolved into putting presents in children's shoes). An influx of Dutch immigrants to North America in the 18th century brought with them the tradition of this celebration. It is generally agreed that the Dutch nickname is what evolved into today's name Santa Claus.

In 1823 the poem we know as "Twas The Night Before Christmas" was first published. This iconic piece of literature launched the modern view of St. Nick as a jolly old elf. Picture #3 was supposed to illustrate this topic as it was flagged as being an original illustration for the poem. Turns out it is a Thomas Nast engraving and dates from the 1880's. This really threw off my chronological idea for the pictures but it works great to show how Santa changed over the years. More about Mr. Nast later...

Picture #2 is an engraving of Father Christmas (Santa is still referred by this name in the British Isles) from the original printing of Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol published in 1843. This now-classic story is yet another piece of the puzzle that makes up our modern Christmas celebration.

Picture #4 is a Norman Rockwell depiction of Santa from 1920. By this time the pious monk has transitioned into the rotund, red-

clad figure our mind's eye envisioned from the (apparently unillustrated) poem where he comes down the chimney with a big bag of presents.

So why is it generally accepted that a Greek monk who lived in Turkey, is particularly beloved in Holland and famous worldwide a resident of the North Pole? Thomas Nast, was an American political cartoonist who submitted 33 Christmas drawings to Harper's Weekly magazine between 1863 and 1886, one of which featured a village called "Santa Claussville, N.P." NP of course, stands for North Pole. Mr Nast made it up! I gave up trying to find that cartoon but found this cheerful Santa portrait Nash sketched in 1886. There are several butterfly-affect stories woven throughout St. Nicholas' long history. This little gem I would never have guessed.

The Yarrow Babysitters Club—A Valuable Community Service By Michelle Superle

Hey Yarrow—have you ever hankered for date night only to end up stuck at home for yet ANOTHER Netflix n' Chill "home date night" as we (somewhat pathetically) call it at my house because you couldn't find a babysitter?

That was our life... before the Yarrow Babysitters Club came to town. But now we have a life again.

That's all thanks to Nina and Addi, the club's founders.

They were inspired by the absolutely fabulous book series of the same name by Ann M. Martin, which was "published by Scholastic between 1986 and 2000 and... sold 180 million copies"; it was also adapted as a TV series and film in the 90s, and then oh the irony—as a Netflix Original series in 2020 (Wikipedia). Thanks to this awe-inspiring franchise, Addi and Nina started dreaming of their own babysitters club business when they were in Grade 3. Then, in Grade 5, they completed the babysitter training course at Yarrow Community School. Finally, this past summer, they launched the business.

As a children's literature professor, I am both tickled and thrilled by this real-life "adaptation" of a beloved children's book series into hands-on action that both empowers children and benefits It certainly seems that I'm not alone in my gratitude, because Nina and Addi have successfully scaled up the business according to community demand. The club now includes an impressive total of ten babysitters.

Equally impressive is the way the founding members (with support and guidance from their parents) have developed club policy with safety as the top priority. One of their key strategies for supporting safety of both babysitters and the babysat is to send pairs of sitters to each job. They also make sure each pair has a working cell phone with them, as well as requiring parents to complete and submit an enrolment sheet that includes contact information and an emergency contact.
